JULinux or Just Use Linux is remastered from Ubuntu Ultimate Edition 1.9 which was remastered from Ubuntu 8.04.1. There were a few reasons this was done. One reason was for games such as Call Of Duty 4 and Command and Conqueror 3, as they would not run correctly on Ubuntu 8.10.

Installing this system is simple. Simply click the Install icon on the desktop while the Live CD/DVD is loaded in your computer. When you install this very small lightweight distribution you will notice that there are many features that are not installed; installing these extra features is one of the first things you should do. However, the upgrade to Ubuntu 9.10 will probably result in a complete system meltdown.

To install these extra features, please do the following:

1. Be sure that you are connected to the internet.
2. Locate the folder named "JULinux Extras" on your Desktop.
3. Open that folder.
4. Look over the install scripts and see what interests you and double click on them to install.
5. You will be asked to enter your User password and it's usually owner.
6. The computer will then download and install the files from the scripts you selected.

Your Linux System is now ready for use.

Lets discuss how to navigate the Applications menu and Icons on the Desktop.

The [Applications menu](#) (Located in the upper or lower left hand part of your screen or lower left) is where you will find all of the programs you have installed.

- The [Accessories sub menu](#) contains a lot of useful utilities that can quickly get you on your way and also allow you to maintain your system.
- The [Games sub menu](#) contains all of your installed games including any Windows games installed in [Play On Linux](#).
- The [Graphics sub menu](#) contains most everything you will ever need to work on pictures or any graphical editing, however for those of you who want to know everything there is to know about editing graphics you should check out [the Gimp](#). [The Gimp](#) is a very advanced graphics program but if you study the link above you should find all the support you need.
- The [Internet sub menu](#) contains all internet related programs including web browsers, Skype (with the extra utilities pack installed), web editors, WiFi, FTP, and instant messengers.
- The [Office sub menu](#) contains programs related to getting work done such as [OpenOffice.org](#) which is just like Microsoft Office 2003 but with 2007 compatibility.
- The [Other sub menu](#) is where you will find programs you have installed that the system does not know what to do with.
- The [Programming sub menu](#) is for most programming languages such as HTML editing,

PHP, Python, C++, ect.

- The [Sound and Video sub menu](#) is one of my favorites. There you can find video editors, players, music editors, players, etc.
- The [System Tools sub menu](#) is for people who want to have more control over their computer.

As for the Desktop, you can see it looks very similar to Microsoft's Windows Vista and Windows 7. On the Desktop we have:

- My Computer: a direct link to all of the hard drives and devices plugged in to your computer.
- My Documents: a direct link to your home folder.
- Recycle Bin: your Trash bin.
- aMSN: an MSN Messenger and Windows Live Messenger program.
- Lookout Express: a funny way of saying it's like Outlook Express.
- Internet Browser: Mozilla Firefox.
- Media Player: a player that will play just about anything after installing the Codecs pack.
- JULinux Extras: where you will find the extra installers that make your system complete.
- Control Panel: where you can change anything in your system. (Similar to the Microsoft Windows' Control Panel.)
- Kiukkuviina_tekee_tepposet.ogg: a sound file to play if you need to test your sound. (It's very loud)

Shutting down your computer is simple. Just click System, Quit, Shut Down.

JULinux was designed to fit on a CD if

possible using cramfs. We cut a lot of unnecessary extras out of the initial system. This is why you need to install the JULinux Extras or any other programs you want.
